Year 7 Geography - Liveability Walk


This term in Year 7 Geography, students have been studying the concept of liveability. As part of this study students in groups E and F have trialled a new fieldwork activity exploring the liveability of the local area around Highvale. Students used a cloud-based software package, Survey123 to collect data on the features, services, and infrastructure available, as well as taking note of problems such as graffiti and vandalism. Further, they identified things like the condition of roads and housing, the amount of traffic and the amount of vegetation. They were able to use GPS-enabled devices, such as an Android tablet or iPad to enter their observations using Survey123. This app can be set up to record a range of information, and uses GPS to tie the data to the specific latitude and longitude coordinates at which it is recorded.







Back in class, students could log onto to the web-based version of the app to access the data, including maps, graphs, and tables of raw data. They are currently analysing the data to help them write an assignment on how liveable Glen Waverley is as a suburb. Some of the results are shown below. Well done to the students for demonstrating our school values on the day and thanks to Mrs Valentine and Mr Marshall for helping run the trip.
