### **SPACE-X-PLORE USA 2023 PROGRAM**

There is an opportunity for students at Highvale Secondary College to visit the Unites States of America on the Space-X-Plore program run by Global Learning Expeditions. The trip will be in the September 2023 school holidays next year and is open to all students in Years 8-11. (Must be 14 at time of travel).

SPACE-X-PLORE is an 11 day program and covers 3 incredible destinations- Orlando, San Francisco & Los Angeles and combines STEM, science and space activities in a fun hands on way.

### The first 4 days of the tour are spent in Orlando at the NASA Kennedy Space Centre!

The space centre is 100% owned & operated by NASA so everything in the centre, even the toilet paper is NASA certified! The Kennedy Space Centre is a fully operational rocket launching site, meaning this is the 'real deal' with 2 rockets launching off on Space missions on any given month!

You would take part in a 3 day Kennedy Space Centre Astronaut training experience. Here, you will know what is like to be a real astronaut landing on Mars. Training will be in real mission simulators, at your own duty station. Challenges include, handling emergencies in space, testing robots and learning to how to grow your own vegetables in zero gravity.

One of the highlights of the tour is having a personal session with a real NASA astronaut. If you have ever wanted to ask ANY questions about Space - now is your chance!

Remember - anyone can do this trip - you don't need to be top of the class in physics or maths and best of all its FUN!

### The second part of the tour:

You then get to visit beautiful San Francisco! Here you visit the USS Hornet- an enormous WW2 aircraft carrier. Then head off to the Exploratorium on Pier 15 with over 600 exhibits that combine media, art, science and FUN and all people powered-meaning you make them all go. Walk the Golden Gate bridge, jump on a cable car and hit Union square for a bit of shopping!

Last but not least, visit LOS ANGELES! Spend the day at Knott's Berry Farm- home to some of the wildest rollercoasters in the world! Learn all about the physics of how a rollercoaster defies gravity and then spend the afternoon riding them all! Spend a day at Universal studios, where you will get a back lot tour, and also see Harry Potter World! And lastly, visit the happiest place on earth- Disneyland! Check out the Star Wars ride, Indiana Jones, Space Mountain and MAY more awesome rides!

We are holding an information session on Tuesday 29<sup>th</sup> November at 6pm at South Oakleigh Secondary College, in the Lecture Theatre. Please RSVP your attendance for planning purposes directly to Highvale.sc@education.vic.gov.au by Friday 25th November.

Teaches students and provides additional help


Cares for the students


