



The Annual General Meeting which will see the annual report for 2021 being tabled is scheduled for Tuesday 29th March. This will be a combined meeting of the old and new council so that we have an effective change over.

Year 7 Transition Camp

Over this week our Year 7s visited Lord Somers camp for their annual transition camp. Due to restrictions on numbers this year, the camp was conducted in two splits. Tuesday 15th March and Wednesday 16th March for Year 7A, 7B, 7C, 7D, 7I & 7K and Thursday 17th March and Friday 18th March for Year 7E, 7F, 7G, 7H and 7J. Our new students enjoyed the staples of Kayak paddling, pizza making, group challenges and much more. I would like to thank Mrs Valentine for developing a very intense and well targeted program.

Online NAPLAN testing

NAPLAN 2022 will be conducted as a series of <u>ONLINE</u> tests in May this year. This week students in years 9.1 to 9.6 and 7H participated in preparatory tests of the NAPLAN test application. This investigated the platform provided by the VCAA as well as the internet capacity of the school. The preparation to transition to an ONLINE version of NAPLAN began in late 2021 but was delayed due to Covid restrictions. To ensure that no student can access the world wide web for answers, a special patch needed to be installed on any computer used in the testing. The school has loaded this patch on all netbooks and desktops rather than calling in every student's BYOD device. For May's NAPLAN testing, 50 additional netbooks have now been purchased and are currently being prepared. This will give some 'wriggle room' in-case of battery or other netbook inconsistencies. I would like to thank all the students who took part. Their work will ensure that we have as smooth a process that we can provide.



Interim reports

Interim reports are currently being completed by all subject teachers. These reports will be made available on COMPASS around Thursday 31st March 2022. Parent teacher interviews will be conducted ONLINE on Wednesday 6th April.




