School Tours

School tours for prospective students have now resumed. These are booked via the Trybooking <u>link</u> on our website. We have had strong interest and tours are all full for this term! Additional tour times will be posted soon. Parents of Year 6 students in primary schools will be receiving their enrolment packs at the start of term two from their primary schools. We are looking forward to managing the intake to around 220 students in Year 7 2023.

Online Naplan

All schools will be undertaking an online version of NAPLAN this year. NAPLAN will be for all students in Years 7 and 9.

The process for conducting these Online tests is quite involved and will cause some disruption to the school.

The VCAA are managing the processes and as such requires all computers to have installed a browser to ensure students undertaking the tests cannot refer to the internet. To action this requirement we will be using our school netbooks. Additional netbooks have had to be ordered so that we have enough supplies to cover for the usual, battery failure etc..

To ensure that the school can follow VCAA processes and that our internet bandwidth is sufficient we have to undertake a practice test.

This is scheduled for Wednesday 16 March 2022. 120 Year 9 students will be involved in period 4 focus group and a selection of Year 7 students not on camp will do a practice test during period 5. More details to follow.

My Career Insights is a program for all Year 9 students in government secondary schools. As part of this program students sit the Morrisby Profile Careers Assessment.


What will my child gain from Morrisby Profile?


- Gives students a fascinating insight into their inner strengths and abilities, preferences, motivations, and personality type
- Helps students make important decisions such as what subjects to take in VCE or what the next steps could be based on their preferences
- Provides students with careers suggestions best suited to their inner strengths and abilities plus advice on the routes to those careers and makes appropriate recommendations
- Offers access to over 600 career descriptions including videos, case studies and useful links
- All accounts include a 'login for life' which gives users the ability to develop and refresh their profile and seek—support over time
- Students receive a detailed hardcopy report of their results and a 30-minute meeting with a Morrisby-trained Career Practitioner in May, who will explain the report to your child. If any parents would also like to attend this meeting please notify keg@highvalesc.vic.edu.au

What is involved in Morrisby assessments?

- The Morrisby profiling will be completed online at school on Wednesday 23rd March,
- We ask all students to please bring their own charged devices to school this day.
- Morrisby is a series of verbal, numerical, abstract, spatial and mechanical aptitude assessments
- Students also complete questionnaires on their interests, motivations, personality and work and learning styles
- Students will be given the chance to complete practice questions during Focus Group prior to completing the
 Morrisby Profiling to familirise them with the style of the questions. However, Morrisby is not a test and
 students do not need to study for it.







