

University visit: Monash University

A spokesperson from Monash University came to talk to the Year 12 cohort last Wednesday to discuss the opportunities that the various Monash campuses offer. We were informed about the three main campuses of Monash University: Peninsula, located in Frankston, Clayton, Parkville and Caufield as well as various other overseas campuses/associated universities.

For a significant period, we focused on degrees, particularly those involving arts, science, and engineering as well as the various majors and minors available. This enabled us to find out how degrees work at Monash University. We also found out that clubs, associations, and societies are prevalent at the university. These groups cover a variety of interests and allow students to interact with others who have similar interests rather than just with those within their degree.

The Clayton campus closest to us at Highvale has many amenities accessible to both students and the public, including cafes and restaurants. It even has its own postcode: 3800. By the end of this year, Monash University's Clayton campus is expected to house Australia's first dedicated heart hospital, "The Victorian Heart Hospital". This hospital's second floor will be a space dedicated to the education of students, including lecture theatres and laboratories for engineering and biomedical sciences.

Importantly, the special entry access scheme (SEAS) was discussed. We discovered that with SEAS, it is achievable to get into a Monash University degree even without achieving the ATAR required. Similarly, the spokesperson discussed the 'Monash Guarantee', this allows for those who have experienced financial disadvantages, live in a lower socio-economic area, are Indigenous Australians or attend a Monash listed under-represented school to get into a Monash course with an ATAR less than the lowest selection rank.

Students were sent home with a Monash University information booklet, predominantly discussing the courses available across the campuses. Many important questions were asked and the session with the Monash spokesperson was a valuable learning experience for all.

Police Presentation: Join the Force



On Wednesday the 18th of May, the year twelves had a talk from the Victoria Police about the enrolment program that they offer. Over the course of the hour, they talk about how you can enrol for the police force, the pay that's offered during the training and afterwards when you become a full police officer. They also discussed about the different fields that you can specialise in from being a part of the canine unit, to being a helicopter pilot, to working in forensics and what fields that they specialised when they had first joined the Victoria Police. Near the end as well they had picked out a student to take part in a section of the fitness test that you would have to complete if you wanted to join. For this they had picked out Thrrymund Palany to do the required 5 push-ups to get in the force to which he went above and beyond and completed 15 push-ups, easily making it into the police force. What a legend!


