Senior students benefit from learning in a 'young adult environment' in our school's well-equipped senior study centre. We also support them with study skill workshops, seminars and a residential camp held at the University of Melbourne.

High-achieving students are given many opportunities to move ahead. Our programs feature learning materials tailored to their ambitions and stage of development.

Students who participate in the Victorian high-ability program can further extend their maths and English abilities.

While many of our high-achieving students start their Victorian Certificate of Education (VCE) studies in Year 10, giving them a head-start on boosting their tertiary entrance score.





Activities and programs which bring the student experience to life

At Highvale, our international students have a great range of sporting activities, music productions and leadership programs to choose from.

A highlight of our vibrant music program is instrumental music lessons taught by highly qualified visiting music teachers during school hours.

Students perform for the College community at concerts throughout the year, at the College as well as major public venues such as Government House, Federation Square and Hamer Hall.

All students can be part of our many inter-school teams, in sports such as athletics; badminton; baseball; basketball; cricket; cross country; football; hockey; netball; soccer; softball; swimming; tennis; table tennis; and volleyball.

Throughout the year, students take part in exciting and challenging school camps, designed to foster friendships and develop life skills and social skills. Year 7s attend a transition camp. Year 9s enjoy a city experience adventure camp and outdoor education camps. Years 10 to 11 tour Central Australia, and Year 12 students participate in an extremely valuable study conference.

Highvale has a busy robotics club which participates in interschool competitions, with the team coming 2nd in the national competition in 2019.

The school also offers a wide range of programs which help students develop extra skills and prepare for life after school.

Ensuring students feel happy and at home

Homestay for international students

We understand the challenges facing students, many of whom are living away from their families for the first time

We encourage students to be a part of their 'new family' and involve themselves in homestay family events and celebrations, gaining an insight into the Australian way of life.

Our caring staff consistently monitor and address international students' academic and welfare needs. We communicate any concerns to parents without delay, with students given extra support.

We also provide extra help in students' subject selection and future career plans.

Homestay families will provide:

- a safe, secure, welcoming place to live
- a household compliant with the Child Safe Standards
- a separate single room for the student's personal use
- three meals a day, seven days a week, including snacks
- facilities including a bed, wardrobe, towels and linen
- utilities including gas, electricity, heating and water costs, as well as internet
- cleaning services of common living areas
- the use of living areas within the residence
- study facilities such as a desk, study light and bookcase
- attendance at parent/teacher evenings on behalf of your parents.
