Highvale Secondary College is looking forward to another great year of learning and growth for all our students and would like to advise you of Highvale's voluntary financial contributions for 2026.

Schools provide students with free instruction to fulfil the standard curriculum requirements, and we want to assure you that all contributions are voluntary. Nevertheless, the ongoing support of our families ensures that our school can offer the best possible education and support for our students. We want to thank you for all your support, this has made a huge difference to our school and the programs we can offer.

Within our school this support has allowed us to offer a wide range of subjects and specialised curriculum experiences, including enhanced digital learning opportunities assisted by online learning resource programs and platforms available to our students.

Parent support has also assisted with the general maintenance and improvement of our college facilities. This has contributed to the:

- installation of air conditioning throughout every classroom
- a fully equipped weights and fitness centre
- the enhancement to our college gardens and outdoor spaces for student use
- the upgrade of two tennis courts to a fully synthetic surface allowing multi-sport use for students
- the purchase and installation of bleachers on the hardcourts, providing additional seating for students and visitors during physical education classes and school events
- the replacement of garden bed edging in selected areas around the school with new seating to provide additional spaces for students to sit and socialise
- installation of a new PA system across the College, including updated emergency management signals
- installation of cameras above the kitchen benches to make teacher demonstrations more visible and engaging, improving the overall learning experience for students
- installation of Vivi units across all TVs and projectors throughout the College to provide staff with easier wireless connectivity to support more interactive and engaging learning experiences for students
- the addition of new tables in the G Block breakout area and selected classrooms. These upgrades have created a more functional environment for students, providing improved spaces for learning, collaboration, and exams
- installation of a new locker bay next to our undercover canteen area to accommodate our growing student enrolments
- construction of the college theatre
- provision of shade structures around the school
- installation of college fencing
- installation of an acoustically engineered music pod for our instrumental music.

We encourage our wonderful college community to continue to provide positive financial support for our students through parent contributions and fundraising efforts.

ONE PAGE OVERVIEW



FREE INSTRUCTION

- Schools provide students with free instruction and ensure students have free access to all items, activities and services that are used by the school to fulfil the requirements of the Curriculum. This includes the Victorian Curriculum F-10, the Victorian Certificate of Education (VCE) including the VCE Vocational Major and the Victorian Pathways Certificate.
- Schools may invite parents to make a financial contribution to support the school.



PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS

Schools can request contributions from parents under three categories:

Curriculum Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for curriculum items and activities which the school deems necessary for students to learn the Curriculum.

Other Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for non-curriculum items and activities that relate to the school's functions and objectives.

Extra-Curricular Items and Activities

Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides for free to deliver the Curriculum. These are provided on a user-pays basis.

- Schools may also invite parents to supply or purchase educational items to use and own (e.g. textbooks, stationery, digital devices).



FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

- Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot pay for items or activities so that their child doesn't miss out.
- Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.



SCHOOL PROCESSES

- Schools must obtain school council approval for their parent payment arrangements and publish all requests and communications for each year level on their school website for transparency.
